Dear Sisters in Christ.

This month which is dedicated to St. Joseph is special to me, as he is my patron saint. I have a statue of "sleeping" St. Joseph, by my bedside which reminds me about how lovingly he took care of his family, the Holy family. Because of this I believe that he too can take care and protect all of us, being children of God's family. I've learned that symbolic of the Gospel, it was always in his sleep when St. Joseph received messages from heaven about Mary, the dangers of Herod, and the name the Child Jesus would take. These messages led to the flight to Egypt to protect his family. Pope Francis has been known to have said that he puts this great saint to work a lot, as he often slips written prayer requests under his statue. He assured us that St. Joseph certainly gets the job done and does it well; and one just needs to be patient. Some of the qualities Pope Francis appreciates in him are: tenderness, silence, concealment (avoiding the spotlight), and his vocation to protect. Inspired by St. Joseph, let us also follow his example of authentic service, and never forget to call on him to intercede for us in prayer.

During this season of Lent, I continue to encourage you all to join us at the Soup and Silence sessions every Friday at 6pm to meditate on Jesus' passion and death, before joining Father Lucio for the Stations of the Cross at 7pm. I also encourage you all to come and join us for the annual CWL Retreat this coming April. We promise it will be an enlightening experience. Finally, for those of you who are single mothers or may know anyone who is, we invite all to come to our next General Assembly on Monday March 4th at 7pm where Sr. John Mary Sullivan will tell us how Momentum can provide valuable support and prayers for single mothers, and help them experience God's love in a very special way. THE MONTH OF MARCH IS DEDICATED TO ST. JOSEPH

We don't know much about him except what is mentioned in the Gospels. Joseph was the husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the foster-father of Jesus. Holy Scripture proclaims him as a "just man," and the Church has turned to Joseph for his patronage and protection. Pope Leo XIII in his encyclical Quamquam Pluries (On the Devotion to St. Joseph) in 1889 explains why we place so much trust in this saint:

"Thus in giving Joseph the Blessed Virgin as spouse, God appointed him to be not only her life's companion, the witness of her maidenhood, the protector of her honor, but also, by virtue of the conjugal tie, a participator in her sublime dignity. And Joseph shines among all mankind by the most august dignity, since by divine will, he was the guardian of the Son of God and reputed as His father among men. Hence it came about that the Word of God was humbly subject to Joseph, that He obeyed him, and that He rendered to him all those offices that children are bound to render to their parents. From this two-fold dignity flowed the obligation which nature lays upon the head of families, so that Joseph became the guardian, the administrator, and the legal defender of the divine house whose chief he was. And during the whole course of his life he fulfilled those charges and those duties. ...It is, then, natural and worthy that as the Blessed Joseph ministered to all the needs of the family at Nazareth and girt it about with his protection, he should now cover with the cloak of his heavenly patronage and defend the Church of Jesus Christ."

"Of all the people I have known with a true devotion and particular veneration for St. Joseph, not one has failed to advance in virtue;

he helps those who turn to him to make real progress.

For several years now, I believe, I have always made some request to him on his feast day, and it was always been granted;

and when my request is not quite what it ought to be, he puts it right for my greater benefit."

NEW - RECIPES

Classic Waldorf Salad

Ingredients

2 cups diced tart apples, or 2 apples

1 tablespoon sugar

2 teaspoons lemon juice

1 cup diced celery

1 cup grapes, halved

½ cup toasted walnuts or pecans, roughly chopped (toasted)

½ cup whipping cream, whipped (or yogurt)

¼ cup mayonnaise

½ teaspoon kosher salt



Add the diced apples to a large mixing bowl and sprinkle with the sugar and lemon juice. Toss to coat. Add the celery, grapes, and nuts. In another bowl, whip the whipping cream until peaks form, then gently fold in the mayonnaise. Fold into the apple mixture and season with the kosher salt. Taste and adjust the seasoning to your liking. Chill for 1 hour or overnight. Serve by itself or on a lettuce leaf.


Core Purpose
